According to the photos, this tree is standing alone with no other surrounding trees, and pear trees do not cause excessive shading themselves. Furthermore, if pears on the ground are not desired, the owner(s) could easily collect these and dispose of them in the garbage, organic waste or otherwise. Saying children could 'slip on rotten pears' is not a reason to fell a tree subject to a TPO and in a conservation area. If it is true that rotten fruit and fox droppings attract flies or other insects, this is part of a natural biological process that contributes to the ecosystem of the environment and is a part of that system. These are not reasons to fell such a tree.
