Your applications dated 15th November, 1938, under the London County Council (General Powers) Act, 1920, have also been considered from a town planning point of view.

With reference thereto, I am directed to inform you that the Council, in pursuance of its powers under the above-named Order, hereby approves the use by you of the premises known as No. 21, Fairhazel Gardens, Hampstead, for the purpose of giving massage and electrical treatment, subject to:-

(1) no notices or advertisement being exhibited on the exterior of the premises, other than a small name-plate;

(2) the residential appearance of the premises to be retained and the windows being kept curtained and not for display purposes;

(3) no employee being engaged in connection with the establishment;

(4) compliance with the provisions of the London Building Acts, 1930 and 1935, where they are not inconsistent with this consent, and with the by-laws in force thereunder; and

(5) compliance with the regulations made by the Council under the London County Council (General Powers) Act, 1920.

The permission is given subject also to due compliance with any local Acts, regulations, building by-laws and general statutory provisions in force in the area and nothing herein shall be regarded as dispensing with such compliance or be deemed to be a consent by the Council thereunder.

I would also remind you that the Council's permission does not modify or affect any personal or restrictive covenants applying to the land or the rights of any person entitled to the benefit thereof.
