e.g. Oak (T3) - fell because of excessive shading and low amenity value. Replant with one standard ash in same position.

Lime- Fell to ground level

Reasons: the tree is causing obvious damage to the garage for which there is no viable solution in terms of pruning or structural engineering to mitigate the damage the tree is causing which in turn could pose a health and safety risk. Structural damage to brick garage which impacts adjoining garages is caused by leaning tree. Roots underneath garages and adjoining properties (2 and 3 Regal Lane) are a significant subsidence risk.

Tree vulnerable to damage in high winds and poses risk to 1,2, and 3 Regal Lane in addition to the garages.

- The garages were built to accommodate a much smaller tree which has now grown larger than is suitable for its location. This is due to lack of tree
- management as there is no freeholder.

Pruning/reducing the tree will not solve the problem as it is leaning against the garage.

Underpinning the garage will not help as the problem is the superstructure. Evidence of previous attempts to accommodate tree but it has grown too much to fit into site.
