Rear Garden:

T1 & T2: 2 x Mature Leyland Cypress - (lefthand boundary):

Reduce height by approximately 2.00m. Reduce lateral and sub-lateral growth overhanging No.35 and the school to clear buildings.

T3: Acer - (Adjacent Conifers): Reduce crown by approximately 20%. Thin crown density by 20%. Remove dead wood throughout.

T4: Large Sycamore - (rear boundary): Reduce crown by approximately 30% (approximately 2.00-2.50m). Thin crown density by 20%.

Reduce crown by approximately 50% (approximately 2.00-2.30m). Thin crown density by 2

T5: Prunus - (rear boundary adjacent Sycamore): This tree is in poor condition. Prune hard back into hedge line and allow to regenerate as park of the hedge.

T6: Bay - (adjacent terrace):

Reduce crown by approximately 30% as is practicable preserving suitable furnishing growth to ensure crown continuity.

Reasons: General maintenance to control encroachment
