We have 2 young children. We are agree with points that have been raised by the CGNA</p> <p>Namely:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>- Noise from so much outside activity all along the road until 10pm every night in a narrow street with higher buildings on both sides than elsewhere in the area, where you get the 'canyon' amplification effect that we all know about.</li> <li>- Antisocial behaviour arising from drinking without food, particularly in the large communal area nearest the Dial which will not be attached to any particular premises and where people could even rock up with bottles from off-licences.</li> <li>- Ongoing activity in the wider area long after the 'streateries' have been cleared away each evening, especially from people who have to move but still have drinks to finish.</li> <li>- Limited room for pedestrians who need to pass each other on the pavement or on the street, when people start to return to the area in large numbers and when the theatres re-open.</li> <li>- Everything continuing for months, and possibly more than a year, well after customers can return to normal dining and drinking inside later this Summer.</li> </ul> <p>Please therefore do reject this request. We would ask that restaurants be enjoyed more so in Soho where outside seating has already been established.</p>
