I am very concerned that a two storey wall, 3 meters deep and directly attached to my property will cause me a huge loss of light to our already low light property. All other extensions in the immediate environs are to the west side of the properties, as this reduces the impact of the loss of light levels to the neighbours - Due to a three storey building to the south of us, we only receive direct light in the afternoon from the west. My other concern is that there is a balustrade on the roof level above the second floor, implying that a terrace is planned for the location, which would overlook the gardens directly and impact on our privacy.	_
