T3 & T4: 2 x Leyland Cypress: Approximately 7.00-8.00m. Fell to ground level.

Reason: Both trees have low amenity value and removal will allow for greater growth of an existing hedge.

T5: Cherry: Fell to ground level.

Reason: To reduce hazard potential as the tree is dead and is beginning to break up.

Lefthand Boundary:

T6: Box Elder: Thin crown density by 20%. T7: Evergreen Oak: Thin crown density by 20%.

Reason: General maintenance.
