1 Reasons for approval-

The renewable energy and sustainability plan to be implemented has been reviewed by the Council's Sustainability Officer who is satisfied that the requirements of the condition have been met. The connection to the existing Somers Town Energy combined heat and power provides a majority of the carbon reductions of 53.7% which enables the proposals to meet the minimum requirement for 'on-site' carbon reduction of 35%. Therefore, condition 139 of

planning permission 2015/2704/P dated 14/10/16 (as amended) can be discharged.

The full impact of the scheme has already been assessed.

As such, the details are in general accordance with policies CC1 and CC2 of the London Borough of Camden Local Plan 2017.
