	<u>Summary of comments</u> Officers have assessed that the installation of permanent bench seating to the shopfront on South End Road and its impact on the design of the shopfront and the footpath would be detrimental to the character of the host building, street scene, pedestrian environment and Hampstead Conservation Area.				
	Whilst it is a material consideration, the placement of tables and chairs on the highway falls outside of planning control, and a planning decision could not control the placement of the furniture or specify a clear highway. Pavement licenses, also known informally as 'Tables and Chairs' licences are assessed and issued by the Council's Highways Team.				
	Following discussions with the applicant regarding the bench seating, this element of the proposal has been removed from revised drawings submitted (drawing number: 12458_A107(b)).				
	No objections have been received regarding the replacement doors. As a result the proposals consist solely of alterations to the entrance doors which are considered acceptable and the reasons for granting permission are set out in the decision notice.
