Assessment

The s.211 notice is for the removal of an ash tree from the rear garden of a residential property that is situated within the Parkhill Conservation Area.

The ash tree is of minimal visibility from the public realm. The tree is likely to be self-sown which does not automatically reduce the value of a tree, in this case it has result in the tree growing in extreme close proximity to a shed and a boundary wall.

The tree bifurcates at approx. 2.5m above ground level; the V-shaped union may be a future point of weakness. The tree has been supressed by neighbouring trees resulting in asymmetric form, with most of the crown overhanging the rear garden of 45 Upper Park Road

The tree is of no known cultural or historical importance and is not of rare species.

It is not expedient for the council to serve a tree preservation order to protect the tree.

The council does not object to the proposed works.
