It is an important part of the streetscape - in line with the features identified in the South Hampstead Conservation Area Appraisal and management Strategy. No evidence is provided of subsidence being caused by this specific tree - it is noted in the form that a report exists but it has not been provided. Camden should be protecting mature trees in line with its clean air goals, climate emergency approach and in line with the conservation area appraisal - as such it should consider application of a TPO on this tree in line with TPOs that are in place for other front garden lime trees in the northern section of Goldhurst Terrace and other streets in the conservation area.

They are also very important for biodiversity given that they are a native species. Trees play a key role for the mental wellbeing not just for people living in the neighbourhood, but for those passing through, and for future generations (see organisations such as CentricLAB for this). Camden Council should consider putting a TPO on this tree, in line with other such trees in the neighbourhood, and also as part of meeting the council's goals on climate and biodiversity, and to help mental health of residents.
