1 palm tree to be removed from rear garden.
Tree has grown to an approximate height of 20 feet, and it is growing at the rate of a couple of feet per annum. The garden measures 5m by 5m, and the tree is less than 4m from the house. This presents multiple risks;

1. contributing factor to movement and perhaps subsidence risk to the house. Cracks have appeared within the walls of the house. The house is built on clay and is a victorian terrace with shallow foundations; it is highly likely to assume that the growth of the tree is contributing to the movement 2. risk to surrounding buildings; both own and of neighbours. At 20 feet of height, were the tree to fall in the event of strong winds, it could damage any number the little research well as well
