## DECISION

## **Householder Application Granted**

Address: 41 Dartmouth Park Road London NW5 1SU

Proposal: Erection of a single storey rear extension and a replacement two storey closet wing with balcony Drawing Nos: 001, 002, 003, 004, 005, 006, 007

The Council has considered your application and decided to grant permission subject to the following condition(s):

Condition(s) and Reason(s):

1 The development hereby permitted must be begun not later than the end of three years from the date of this permission.

Reason: In order to comply with the provisions of Section 91 of the Town and Country Planning Act 1990 (as amended).

2 The development hereby permitted shall be carried out in accordance with the following approved plans: 001, 002, 003, 004, 005, 006, 007

Reason: For the avoidance of doubt and in the interest of proper planning.

3 All new external work shall be carried out in materials that resemble, as closely as possible, in colour and texture those of the existing building, unless otherwise specified in the approved application.

Reason: To safeguard the appearance of the premises and the character of the immediate area in accordance with the requirements of policies D1 and D2 of the London Borough of Camden Local Plan 2017.

4 The living roof in the area indicated on the roof plan hereby approved shall be installed and maintained in accordance with the approved documents.

Reason: In order to ensure the development undertakes reasonable measures to take account of biodiversity and the water environment in accordance with policies CC1, CC2, CC3 and A3 of the London Borough of Camden Local Plan 2017.

Informative(s):

1 Reasons for granting permission:

The proposed development is considered to be acceptable in terms of size and design. The upper ground floor extension and balcony would match the existing wing and projecting balcony in size and height; the resulting full width ground floor extension would match the depth of the existing closet wing. All elements would be subordinate to the host building in bulk and would have appropriate materials with metal windows matching those in next door's extension. The design, scale, siting and materials of the development would be in keeping with the character and appearance of the host property and wider conservation area, and as such the character and appearance of conservation area would remain preserved.

Special regard has been attached to the desirability of preserving or enhancing the conservation area, under s.72 of the Planning (Listed Buildings and Conservation Areas) Act 1990 as amended by the Enterprise and Regulatory Reform Act 2013.

The green roof is welcomed and will provide visual amenity and biodiversity. Its details of design, species and maintenance are considered acceptable.

It is not considered there would be any significant detrimental impact to residential amenity. The development would not extend beyond neighbouring windows to an extent which would result in a significant loss of light or outlook. No new views would be afforded into any neighbouring habitable windows beyond what has been established.

No objections were received following statutory consultation. The site's planning history and relevant appeal decisions were taken into account when coming to this decision.

As such, the proposal is in general accordance with policies D1, D2 and A1 of

the Camden Local Plan 2017 and policies DC3 and DC4 of the Dartmouth Park Neighbourhood Plan 2020. The proposed development also accords with the policies of the London Plan 2021 and National Planning Policy Framework 2019.

- 2 This approval does not authorise the use of the public highway. Any requirement to use the public highway, such as for hoardings, temporary road closures and suspension of parking bays, will be subject to approval of relevant licence from the Council's Streetworks Authorisations & Compliance Team, 5 Pancras Square c/o Town Hall, Judd Street London WC1H 9JE (Tel. No 020 7974 4444). Licences and authorisations need to be sought in advance of proposed works. Where development is subject to a Construction Management Plan (through a requirement in a S106 agreement), no licence or authorisation will be granted until the Construction Management Plan is approved by the Council.
- 3 All works should be conducted in accordance with the Camden Minimum Requirements - a copy is available on the Council's website (search for 'Camden Minimum Requirements' at www.camden,gov.uk) or contact the Council's Noise and Licensing Enforcement Team, 5 Pancras Square c/o Town Hall, Judd Street London WC1H 9JE (Tel. No. 020 7974 4444)

Noise from demolition and construction works is subject to control under the Control of Pollution Act 1974. You must carry out any building works that can be heard at the boundary of the site only between 08.00 and 18.00 hours Monday to Friday and 08.00 to 13.00 on Saturday and not at all on Sundays and Public Holidays. You must secure the approval of the Council's Noise and Licensing Enforcement Team prior to undertaking such activities outside these hours.

4 Your proposals may be subject to control under the Building Regulations and/or the London Buildings Acts that cover aspects including fire and emergency escape, access and facilities for people with disabilities and sound insulation between dwellings. You are advised to consult the Council's Building Control Service, Camden Town Hall, Judd St, Kings Cross, London NW1 2QS (tel: 020-7974 6941).
