There may be good reason to fell them but not even photographs are provided in support of the submission. From the street and satellite imagery these appear to be two very healthy mature trees that add significant natural amenity to the neighbourhood. The application states that the boundary wall is badly damaged. That can be rebuilt but trees cannot. It also states the neighbours are very unhappy about the shading. Perhaps pollarding is an option.
