The neighbourhood is not far from the junction of College Crescent/Avenue Road and Finchley Road, with its 7 lanes of busy traffic, and this green barrier offers some protection to local residents against the noise and air pollution of the traffic, as well as providing a habitat for wildlife. The removal of two trees from this narrow strip of trees would severely deplete the ecological and environmental benefits.  It is said that the trees have destroyed a brick boundary wall but this is not a good reason to fell the trees. If the wall needs to be rebuilt, it should be reconstructed in a manner which accommodates the continuing presence of the trees. (There are numerous examples within the Belsize Conservation Area of adjustments made to walls and of the reconstruction of sections of walls to accommodate the growth of nearby trees.) The trees offer multiple benefits for the neighbourhood and should take priority over the wall.  It is said that one of the trees has severe decay to heartwood, but no evidence has been submitted to support this.
