Assessment

The s.211 notification is for the removal of a group of sycamores, and single sycamore tree and an elder.

The trees are highly visible from the public realm and contribute to the character and appearance of the conservation area. The property is a on a corner plot which increases the prominence of the trees.

G1 is a small group of small, young sycamore on the Hampstead Lane frontage of the property. T1 is semi-mature sycamore and T3 is a small elder tree, both of which are on the frontage on The Grove.

All tree proposed for removal are self-set. While this does not automatically devalue the trees, in this instance it has resulted in the trees growing in positions that are not sustainable in the long term. All the trees are yet to achieve their ultimate size and form and are not afforded the space required to do so. They are growing less than 500mm from the top of a retaining wall. The retaining wall is significantly cracking immediately adjacent to base of the tree proposed for remove on both frontages.

While the trees do contribute to the conservation area because of the position in which they are growing combined with the visible structural damage to the wall and the young age of the trees it is not expedient for the council to serve a tree preservation order.

The council does not object to the proposed works.
