The front and rear gardens of this property have a group of semi mature trees of low amenity value some of which are in poor health. We are proposing removing most of them, re-landscaping the garden and planting more suitable species of trees and shrubs. All trees will be replaced and foliage cover will be reinstated after these works.

T1: Elder at front of property: multi stemmed Elder has grown around a dead Robinia stem. Stems are twisted around eachother causing wounds and subsequent decay pockets to form due to friction and pressure.

Proposed work: Remove to ground level.

T2) Sycamore at front of property: this tree has previously been heavily reduced and has formed a dense and heavy cluster of regrowth. Regrowth will need removing before pressure develops around weak unions. Further to this the roots are causing problems lifting the paving slabs and blocking drainage in the front garden. As the tree is in bad condition and will require ongoing management we are proposing removing the tree and replanting with a smaller and more suitable species.

Proposed work: remove to ground level.

Rear Garden:

T3: Bay tree near house: this tree is approximately 30cm from the rear of the property and has outgrown it's space.

Proposed work: remove to ground level.

T4: Lawson cypress in the middle of garden: this tree has severe die back, has bad form and is of low amenity value.

Proposed work: remove to ground level.

T5: Multi-stemmed bay tree next to T4: this tree will be left unbalanced by removing T4, is of low amenity value and has outgrown it's situation: it is not feasible that any pruning work will restore this tree to good form.

Proposed work: remove to ground level.

T6) Pear on West border of garden: tree has been drawn up by surrounding trees and is disproportionately tall in relation to it's width & volume.

Proposed work: reduce height by up to 2.5 metres into tidy and uniform shape. All cuts will be made to BS3998.

T7: Pear at South West corner of garden: this tree has a severe lean and is of low amenity value.

Proposed work: remove to ground level.

T8: Elder at Southern border of garden: small tree with bad form, signs of decay in base and of low amenity value.
