				The close proximity of the Novel House development to Carnegie House means that windows are overlooked. Occupants of Carnegie House flats 1-6 and flats 7-9 are able to see directly into the Novel House Apartments bordering Christchurch Passage, particularly apartments 7 + 11. Of particular concern is that the rooms in open-sight comprise of the bathroom, bedroom and dressing room for those apartments.	
				Following the invitation of a site visit in September 2020, Gordon Jefferys confirmed that (at least) window 3 for apartments 11 and 13 of Novel House would be fully obscured. Having repeatedly witnessed the sight of the new occupants in Apartment 13 in various states of undress/partially clothed in bath-towels, my fears were confirmed. I had to complain directly to Mr Jefferys that the windows had not been obscured, as agreed, prior to occupancy which provided a direct view into the bathroom.	
				Residents of the upper floor of Carnegie House are at a higher level to Novel House apartments 7 + 11, which affords a direct eyeline into windows 1,2,& 3. Partially obscured glazing has already been successfully installed in certain flats in Novel house. This has prevented direct overlooking whilst allowing for some amenity for occupants of the new apartments. I would suggest this as a suitable compromise.
