Newton Street and Parker Street are primarily residential streets with some commercial and limited retail developments. The existing office development causes no noise nuisance to neighbours as office workers generally arrive and depart their offices during the day. A new theatre space which opens until midnight every weeknight and 12:30 am on Sunday morning would create a noise nuisance as people would be arriving and departing late in the evening and under the influence of alcohol which tends to cause voices to be raised which creates a noise nuisance for neighbours. Already patrons of surrounding bars, restaurants walk through the streets talking loud and laughing creating noise in the late evening. Allowing this development will further exacerbate that problem. |
