SOUTH HAMPSTEAD

The majority of properties in South Hampstead are between 3 and 4 storeys tall and are either detached or semi detached. This spacing of buildings and the mature trees at the roadside help to create a rhythm along the street that is synonymous with traditional leafy Victorian suburbs.
