The Council has considered your application and decided to **refuse** planning permission for the following reason(s):

Reason(s) for Refusal

- The proposed dwelling, by reason of its layout, insufficient outlook and daylight and standard of external amenity space would result in sub-standard residential accommodation for future occupants, contrary to Policy H6 (Housing Choice and mix) of the Camden Local Plan 2017.
- The proposed development, in the absence of a legal agreement to secure car-free housing, would be likely to contribute unacceptably to parking stress and congestion in the surrounding area and fail to promote more healthy or sustainable transport choices, contrary to policy T2 (Parking and car-free development) of the Camden Local Plan 2017 and Policy 7 (Sustainable Transport) of the Fortune Green and

West Hampstead Neighbourhood Plan 2015.
