This application has been assessed under Covid-19 restrictions and a site visit has not taken place. However additional visual information has been provided showing a Broadcroft Whitbed sample available to view at the Cemetery.

The submission confirms that Portland limestone Broadcroft Whitbed will be used for the mausoleum. This natural stone is the highest quality limestone and is considered appropriate for the construction within Highgate Cemetery.

No harm will be exerted by this proposal to the setting of the adjacent listed monuments.

No comments have been received as a result of the public consultation through a press notice and a site notice.
