I hope you can help. I am trying to register an objection to a planning application for a development on Spring Place, converting a building into an Amazon Substore.

For some reason the camden website will not bring up the application and I am at a loss as to how I can register an objection.

My objection is as follows:

'I am deeply concerned that recent moves by Camden to implement traffic calming in the west side of Kentish Town means the only suitable access to the site will be via the south end of Grafton Road. This part of the road is already seeing increased traffic as a result of road closers in and around north 'Grafton Road and Queen's Crescent. The neighbouring Ryland Road is the only way to turn right onto Prince of Wales Road and is already too narrow for most vehicles one way. I also hear there are plans to implement similar measures on Holmes Road which will mean 100% traffic is forced past my house. It is worth noting that Grafton Road is highly residential with many families. There is currently parking on both sides of the road. Large trucks create fumes and also add to noise pollution. The build designs echo noise subtantially to the upper floors which are mostly bedrooms and therefore further increases to traffic will significantly impact residents and children in the area.
