Proposed Development in Brief

Planning permission is sought for:

• Change of Garage doors into Glass

Application Site

The application site is located within the Highgate Village Conservation Area, wherein the Council has a statutory duty to pay special attention

to the desirability of preserving or enhancing the character or appearance of that area, in accordance with Section 72 of The Planning (Listed

Buildings and Conservation Areas) Act 1990 (as amended).

Nos. 91 to 103 Swain's Lane form a terrace of residential properties that sit at a right angle to the main (north-south) part of Swain's Lane.

101 Swain's Lane is the next to last house, not visible from the Main Swain's Lane road.

Existing

Currently all the garages of the terrace are not used as garages.

There is a strong sense of rhythm along the terrace, which is created in part by the recessed entrances, and the rhythm contributes to the strong character of the terrace.

Proposed

The proposal is to replace the existing garage doors of 97 swains Lane with glazing units to guarantee a thermal efficiency, natural light and ventilation to the internal space.

The design proposal confirms the established volumetric rhythm of the terrace introducing the same frosted channel glass and a solid full height timber window, in perfect harmony with the modernist design of the building.

The proposed frosted glass is Pilkington Glass Channels, to match the existing.

The proposed material of the glass window is timber, to match in thickness, colour and finishes the existing front door and garage doors.

The current proposal will establish a design guideline for all future conversions of the garage doors of the the terrace.
