This neighbourhood is, by and large, populated by families with young children and is therefore not stall suitable for an enterprenounce acute critication institution. When is the assurance of professional and pashod care for young people who may have exponenced severe trauma and who can represent a threat to themselves and to others in the community.

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These homes have attracted trouble to neighbours through drug use, noise, late night police calls, petty crime and general disruption to the community. I do appreciate there is an acute need for these homes across the UK, but I think that these young people would be better served in homes outside of the oil y certire.

- If We are concerned that this ill-thought-out proposal will lead to eignificant disruption to the area. I understand that there was a childrens home similar to the one being proposed on Falkland Road. From local neighbours. This previous experience would clearly suggest that this is not a suitable area for another such operation.
