Suggested work: - reduce vertical overlong back to previous reduction points - deadwood - thin canopy - lift all round to 2.5m rear garden T2Ash x 1(Fraxinus excelsior)This large previously pillared ash needs pruning. Suggested work: - reduce back to previous reduction points equating to a reduction of 1.5-2m all round
 leave small furnishing growth rose growing throughout lower canopy, rear garden T3Himalayan Birch x 1(Betula utilis)This large previously reduced Himalayan birch requires pruning. Suggested work: reduce the height by 1.5-2m reduce the lateral growth by 1-1.5m thin internally rear garden T4Ginkgo/Maidenhair (Ginkgo biloba)This small ginkgo has previously been Tree x 1 reduced. Suggested work: reduce the height by 1.5m reduce the lateral growth by 1.5m reduce the lateral growth by 0.5m
T6Holly x 1(Ilex aquifolium)This large holly has not been pruned in several years. Suggested work:

- trim to create conical shape

- lift by 0.5-1m

Find garden T7Laurel x 1(Prunus spp)- reduce height by 1.5m - reduce lateral growth by 0.5-1m - remove creeper from laurel but leave on wall front garden

front garden

T8Laurel x 1(Prunus spp)- reduce height by 1m - reduce lateral growth by 1m

shape

front garden T9Himalayan Birch x 1(Betula utilis)This large previously reduced Himalayan Birch half overhangs the road and requires a full crown reduction. Suggested work:

- reduce the height by 2m

- reduce the lateral growth by 2m
