Objection to Planning Application 2021/029110, 24 Lady Margaret Road

I have only just heard about this proposal. I live in a house [redacted] and I think the way least you could have done is to inform me personally instead of just posting a notice on a tree. I am writing to object to the proposed development at 24 Lady Margaret Road on the following grounds:

1) Safety of children's school
- I strongly feel that the proposal to change 24 Lady Margaret Road from an HMO (housing exchange) closer to a children's home - which I understand will typically host 14 to 16 year old teenagers - seemed too close to the house in a housing environment - does not take the complex needs of young people properly into consideration.



- The care workers appear wholly unsuitable. There is a lack of therapeutic areas and facilities in the plans, and there are only two part-time staff proposed. This can in no way be enough resources to care for a group of young people. The part-time staff would suggest that the young people should be largely unsupervised. Further, the proposal is concerning that the applicant appears to not understand of children's services and have no valid expertise in this area - also understand that the property number is not a recognised specialist service. Indeed, it is not.

- The plans submitted to show seven bedrooms, but do not identify how many would be suitable bedrooms. The seven bedrooms would be too cramped to provide care for young people with complex needs. The plans also propose erecting a separate building in the back garden which shows that the accommodation is not for housing a large group of children and staff. If a building were to be erected, this would further reduce the outdoor space - ensure that outdoor garden space are a fundamental necessity for children and this further illustrates the unsuitability of the property for the proposed development.

- There has been no consultation with the local community about this proposed application. It is also sad to say that the application has been put through at the height of the warm weather, with the chance for children being in the August Bank Holiday weekend. Many areas in children's away during school holidays are not fully open, and have therefore not had the chance to raise concerns or objections. I urge the council to review these decisions and to engage with the wider local community as much as possible. I understand that some in the community have asked the council for further information and details, but this was not been.

- I do not think that the suitability of the area has been properly assessed. This neighbourhood is, by and large, populated by families with young children and is therefore not at all suitable for an entrepreneur and social club like 'Salsk' (sic). Where is the social area of professionals or a cluster of users of young people who may have experienced several traumas and do not represent a threat to themselves and to others in the community.

These houses have attracted trouble to neighbours through drug use, noise (late night police calls, petty crime and general disruption to the community). Do appreciate there is an acute need for these houses across the UK, but I think that these young people would be better housed in homes outside of the city centre.

- We are concerned that this ill-thought-out process will lead to significant disruption to the area. I understand that there were a children's home - similar to the one being proposed - on Finsford Road. From local newspapers, I have been informed that it became a house for drug dealing, noise and additional problems. This previous experience would clearly support that this is not a suitable area for another such operation.

- 1. Conservation Area
 - The applicant proposes erecting a separate building in the back garden. The design of the development is not at all in keeping with the conservation area and poses significant harm to the traditional character of the area.
 - This proposed building does not respect local context and character; it doesn't preserve or enhance the historic environment and heritage assets and does not integrate well with the surrounding streetscape as required in the Council's Local Plan Policy D7. It would be detrimental to the street scene.
 - Further, the properties on this street have balconies in their back gardens. Its design is out of character with the area and sets a worrying precedent.
 - Erection of this separate building would require felling at least one healthy tree - a fully live tree in the garden. This has not been included in the plans. These plans also reduce existing garden space which we know is valuable for wildlife, the environment and wellbeing.

- 2. Effect of Design and Size
 - Due to the proposed development's bulk and prominence it would cause overdevelopment of the site. The scale, massing and height of the proposed development would have a harmful effect on the amenity of my neighbours' living space and garden. Where there is currently a green space, the applicant proposes filling it. The proposed developments proximity and large scale this will impact my neighbours' openness and unobstructed view to life.
 - The proposed extension for the foundations of the building may pose a risk to the foundations of neighbouring properties. There is also a concern that the disturbance of ground during the building process could lead to potential subsidence of nearby buildings. This is an area which is already at risk of subsidence.
