

Subject: Comments on 2021/2526/P

Dear Miriam,

Apologies for the delay in response. I had emailed about a site visit, however I think this has been lost in communication and so I am giving you our revised comments now.

I appreciate that there are plenty of examples of inappropriate plant equipment throughout this conservation area. However I do not believe that this should be taken as a reason to presume the unconditional approval of further plant without sufficient justification.

The Charlotte Street Conservation Area Appraisal and Management Strategy is clear that there should be a presumption against approval of new plant.

Under Current Issues the first paragraph (12.1) states:

'Developments over the recent decades have influenced the character and appearance of the Charlotte Street Conservation Area. There is likely to remain significant pressure for change ... In addition, there is likely to be ... further pressure for air conditioning, plant and telecommunications equipment.'

## While paragraph 13.13 states:

'It is clear from the Conservation Area Appraisal that there is considerable pressure for redevelopment and new development across the conservation area. This pressure comes from a number of sources of different scales: ... a range of small scale change that can, cumulatively, have a significant impact on the character of an area (e.g. roof extensions; rear extensions, satellite dishes and aerials, fire escapes, plant);

As justification for the proposed external plant the application simply states that: 'several options were considered and eventually discounted due to lack of space'. None of these options are shown on plan and frankly, given that a water tank can fit inside a cupboard, I find it difficult to believe that there is no space within an entire terrace for a single tank.

Paragraph 13.22 of the Charlotte Street Conservation Area Management Strategy states: 'The same attention to detailed design and high quality should be applied to smaller alterations such as shop fronts, signage, extensions and the siting and design of external flues and plant. These can harm the character and appearance of the area to an extent belied by their individual scale.'

I do not believe that the same attention to detailed design has been applied to this application. GRP is a low-cost material inappropriate in a conservation area. The applicants are simply placing two boxes on a roof without any regard for design.

We therefore maintain our objection. While approval of plant has become routine in recent years, the management strategy is clear that plant does generally cause harm to the conservation area, and that that harm does not depend upon visibility from the public realm. If things are to be done properly, this application should not be approved.
