The false acacia (T2), in particular, is a mature attractive tree which makes a significant contribution to the streetscape - it is assumed that this is the tree subject to a TPO. It appears that the brick wall will need to be rebuilt anyway so it should be reconstructed in a manner that accommodates the trees. Trees are very important to the character of this conservation area and so should be given priority and retained when work is carried out to boundary walls.
