T1: Silver Birch (Betula pendula) located on the east-side of the front driveway - Reduce and shape canopy by approximately 1.5-2m in height and evenly reduce the lateral spread by approximately 1.5-2m. Remove any major deadwood over 50mm. T2: Multi stem London Plane (Platanus x Hispanics) – Reduce and shape canopy by approximately 1.5-2m in height and evenly reduce the lateral spread by

approximately 1.5-2m. Remove any major deadwood over 50mm. Lift over the drive and footpath to approximately 3.8m (Council's specifications) T3: Silver Birch (Betula pendula) located on the west-side of the front driveway – Reduce and shape canopy by approximately 2.5-3m in height and evenly reduce the lateral spread by approximately 1m. To the west-side of the tree there is a large limb facing the property which has included bark at the union, I would suggest reducing this limb to the upright growth point to reduce weight, therefore stabilising it for the future. Remove trunk suckers and any major deadwood over 50mm. Lift over the drive and footpath to approximately 3.8m (Council's specifications) T4: Shrub located on the west-side of the front driveway - Reduce and shape by approximately 1m in height and evenly reduce lateral spread by approximately

1m. Lift over the drive and footpath to approximately 3.8m (Council's specifications)
