I find it difficult to understand why this door was not requested at the same time as the roof terrace. Knowing there was a window, I didn't think the roof would be used for outdoor activities, so I did not object. Now I would have to consider that children adults activities/parties would be within a few feet of my bedroom

Lighting has already been embedded into this roof, which is causing trouble during the right as it shines onto my bedroom window. Is it acceptable to have external lighting that is only a couple of feet from someone's bedroom window? Has this lighting been agreed or approved?

I would have to keep my window shut, which is not healthy for an asthmatic who likes the window open for fresh air, and I would need to keep my curtains closed, which would affect my

I have concerns about the conservation of the area. There are no other active roof top terraces in this neighbourhood. It would be quite a drastic change to the building to change a window for a door on the first floor, and I don't think this would comply with conservation.

There has been damage done to the adjoining wall due to the many previous planning applications, and I fear that more works will only cause more damage. If you check the history of the applications made for this property, you will see that we have suffered noise, dust and disruption for the past two years. The numerous internal and external works continued throughout lockdown while I was told to "stay at home"

- there was no escape. I was often reassured by the owners that the works would be finished long before now, yet more and more works have been planned.

There seems to be no end to the changes to this building, each change straying further and further away from any conservation of the area. Bit by bit, one planning application after another, this building has been altered beyond what should be acceptable.

These property developers don't seem to care for conservation or for their neighbours. This building is no longer similar to other buildings nearby, and I hope that no further changes would be permitted. There is no need to change this window to a door, and it would not be an improvement to the building. It would cause privacy and conservation issues.

I am sorry that this has become longwinded, but please could you take these points into account when making a decision about the planning application to change this window into a door? Thank you.
