Dear Planners and Tree Officers,

Planning list 657  
2021/ 5193/T. 35 Dartmouth Park Avenue  
No objection to the work on the 4 Lime trees or the height reduction and shaping of the Bay tree.

(Number 33A has vegetation over a wide area of the pavement).

List 658  
2021/5329/T. 24 Dartmouth Park Avenue  
No objection to the work on the Magnolia or Maple: much needed.

2021/5373/T. Highcroft, 170 Highgate Road  
No objection to the reduction to previous points on this magnificent tree.

List 659  
2021/5043/T. 5 Boscastle Road, front garden  
The builder's hoarding is now down at the front of the house so the Bay tree is now visible in it's much reduced state. I consider that it has been 'hacked at' and not 'shaped and re-balanced' as in the application.  
Again no evidence of the Willow sapling to the right hand side.

2021/5450/T. 5 Boscastle Road, rear garden  
No objection to the work on the Bay tree.  
Unable to comment on the Sycamore sapling as unable to access.  
I regret that the four Beech trees have not been maintained. We do not have many in Dartmouth Park. (A Beech hedge would possibly have been more suitable). I personally prefer that they are crown reduced and thinned and not felled. However, I do realise that all four cannot reach maturity and would need regular reduction. I was only able to view the wall from Grove Terrace Mews, but it looked substantial.
