Erection of timber storage unit containing 2x air conditioning (condenser) units in rear garden. (Retrospecitive)

The Council has considered your application and decided to **refuse** planning permission for the following reason(s):

Reason(s) for Refusal

- The applicant has failed to provide sufficient information to demonstrate that the proposed plant would operate in accordance with the Council's minimum noise and vibration standards and that that the plant, when operating at full capacity, would be capable of doing so without causing noise disturbance and harm to the local residential environment, contrary to policies A1 (Managing the impact of development) and A4 (Noise and vibration), of the London Borough of Camden Local Plan 2017.
- 2 In the absence of dynamic thermal modelling to demonstrate the need for active

cooling equipment, the Council cannot be satisfied that the proposed works are necessary and that appropriate climate adaptation measures to reduce the impact of urban and dwelling overheating could not be achieved by other preferred measures as set out in the cooling hierarchy. The proposal is therefore contrary to Policy CC2 (Climate change adaptation measures) of the Camden Local Plan 2017.
