PROPOSED WORKS

Reduce by 5m in height, 2m sides to previous pollard points.

T2/ LIME, Located in front garden, Highway, public right of way with High Footfall and property/neighbouring property within target zone.

This past season has seen several profuse flushes of Copprulus disseminatus (fairy ink cap) fruiting bodies present at base of tree/adjacent wall, a saprophytic species of fungi that live on decayed wood/organic matter. This year has been the first this species has been identified on this site.

Tree has a slight lean towards the highway/footway, base is showing evidence of fibre buckling on side of lean.

Area of most fruiting bodies was side opposite lean, there appears to be extensive deadwood/decay in this area, possibly from a historical wound/co dominant stem occluded to main tree, this area produces hollow ring with mallet, as I follow stem with mallet there is a hollow ring into base of main stem and some of the way up likely where decay has travelled into base of main stem, fruiting bodies were also present in this area.

On the side opposite lean where the stem rings hollow there appears to be an area of dysfunction where the stem is showing retarded growth manifesting itself as a flat area on this side of tree, There are 2 vertical ribs running up offside of lean, either side of area of cross sectional flattening evidence of reaction growth due to suspected decay and dysfunction.

Taking into account the evidence of decay (Lean, profuse and recent fruiting bodies, Trees body language) management through pruning would be impractical and would detract from the trees limited amenity value my recommendation would be to remove for reasons of safety and replace with suitable species to preserve long term amenity of street scene.

PROPOSED WORKS

Fell to ground level, replace with a standard sized tree of a suitable species within 3m of trees original location.
