Having considered the proposals with reference to information held in the Greater London Historic Environment Record and/or made available in connection with this application, I conclude that the proposal is unlikely to have a significant effect on heritage assets of archaeological interest.

The site does not lie in an Archaeological Priority Area. According to the archaeological desk based assessment (MOLA 2021), the site was not developed until the mid 19th century and there is little potential for significant archaeology prior to this period.

The construction of the current buildings on the site has had a substantial impact on the below ground deposits and any deep cut archaeological remains that might survive beneath the current foundations would be of low significance. Further archaeological work is therefore not recommended.

No further assessment or conditions are therefore necessary.

This response relates solely to archaeological considerations. If necessary, Historic England's Development Advice Team should be consulted separately regarding statutory matters.
