- Please note that any approval given by the Council does not give an exemption from the requirements to comply with the Wildlife and Countryside Act 1981 (as amended), or any other Acts offering protection to wildlife. Where the removal of dead/dangerous tree(s) has taken place the owner has a duty under Section 213 of the Town and Country Planning Act 1990 (as amended) to plant a replacement tree. In this case the Council recommends a pear tree (Pyrus communis) be planted as a heavy standard with a girth size of 14-16cms. Failure to plant an appropriate replacement tree may result in the Council serving a Tree Replacement Notice.
