A brick wall would need foundations and these would inevitably impact on the roots of the lime trees which would become unsafe and they would have to be felled as well. If the council refuses permission for a wall they would also be doing something towards saving three of Hampstead's precious trees (and our few remaining trees certainly need saving).
