Insufficient detail is given for proposed reduction of T4 Horse Chestnut which is a mature specimen. The Highgate Society submitted the following comment: There would be no objection to these works. The golden Lawson cypress to be felled is very close to the house and there are other trees nearby. The applicant intends to plant a replacement tree in a better location. 								

Assessment

The application is for the removal of a golden Lawson's cypress, the coppicing of a hazel and pruning works to two sycamores, a horse chestnut tree and a cherry tree. The trees are within the gardens of a residential property this is situated within the Highgate Village Conservation Area.

The golden cypress is of low visibility from the public realm and is not considered to significantly contribute to the character and appearance of the conservation area. The tree is close to the property and is far from achieving its ultimate size and form, and will not tolerate pruning well.

The pruning and coppicing works are not considered to be harmful to the character and appearance of the conservation area.

The council has no powers to add conditions, relating to replacement planting or otherwise, when determining s.211 notifications.

Providing justification for the proposed works is not a validation requirement of s.211 notifications.

It is not expedient for the council to serve a tree preservation order to protect the trees.

The council does not object to the proposed works.
