and I am contacting you to oppose any plans

to provide a licence for an HMO in our building.

I have been calling you over the last few weeks and left a number of voicemails to your direct line at Camden Council, which you have unfortunately not returned.

We have noticed a planning application to turn the 3 illegal studios at the ground and basement floors of our building into an HMO. The planning notice is attached to a post at the front of our building, but someone has moved it to foot level (instead of eye level) to conceal it from view.

The First Floor of the building, which my flat occupies, is of a good standard and with professional tenants. HMOs are, as you know, usually of high-risk tenants with high risks, high turnover of people, and high insurance premiums.

The application no. is 2019/2165/P. The above comes as a very big surprise to me as I am registered with Camden to receive planning applications and I did not receive anything.

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Furthermore, I do not know why part of a professional building is considered to be turned into an HMO (strongly affecting the owners and occupiers of the rest of the building) and whether this is usual practice. I was under the impression it is not.

I wish to voice my strong objection to these plans and do not know why we have not been directly contacted under the consultation. Furthermore, the application does not seem to be open for consultation online.
