Replant with one standard ash in same position. Work on four trees (numbers T5 to T8 – shown in a site plan and three photographs is now urgent. The details are as follows: Number T6 has an old decaying wound at 2 metres. The decay extends into the live stem which is unbalanced towards the road. Number T7 has Kretzschmaria deusta fruiting body present on the roadside at the base of the tree. The tree forks into two stems at 2 metres. There is a bark included junction between the two stems and decay from an old wound at the same point. One stem grows at 45 degrees over the road. It has been recommended that: •T6 be pollarded at 3 metres •T7 be felled as a high priority which we have been told should be within the next 3 months. •That the adjacent trees numbers T5 and T8 be reduced by 3 – 5 metres given the increasing incidents of very high wind speeds when trees are often in full leaf, due to climate change. 6.
