Firstly, due to loss of light or overshadowing that will affect my garden as well as other gardens in Acol Road, as a result of the erection of additional storey. Secondly, due to the negative effect it will have on the character of the conservation area, where certain guidelines have been implemented in order to keep in-line with the traditional look; all the other mews houses currently do not have additional roof extensions and this will create inconsistency in the overall look of the mews and area. The materials proposed for use are also not in-line with existing buildings. The proposed extension will also increase the visual bulk for all surrounding buildings, which will oppose to the existing conservation area strategy. Thirdly, there is concern that the construction will have a negative effect on adjacent mews houses (including my own), as the structural changes proposed, in particular the lowering of the level of the existing roof, are likely to damage the overall stability of the buildings.
