I refer to Application 2021/5944/T regarding the Sycamore in the front garden of 132 Abbey Road, kindly note it is not 134 as mentioned in the Application.

An Arboricultural Report was prepared on behalf of Insurers for the Freeholders of 132 – 134 Abbey Road Limited because of subsidence damage to 134 Abbey Road. It also advised that the sycamore in the front garden of 132 Abbey Road should be felled.

It is with great reluctance that we accept the necessity to remove this tree as we value the importance of trees to the environment and the street scape. Unfortunately, pruning over the years has not prevented the tree from growing and the trunk circumference increasing substantially.

We have planted 5 new trees in the grounds of 132 - 134 Abbey Road over the last 3 years. Three of which were provided by Camden Forest 2025 and two won in a "Trees for Londoners Programme" as part of the Woodland Trust Big Climate Fightback in 2019.

In the circumstances, we trust that the need for this tree to be removed to prevent further damage to the property will be accepted and that our efforts to ensure Camden is as green as possible are recognised.
