- e.g. Oak (T3) fell because of excessive shading and low amenity value. Replant with one standard ash in same position.

Lime Trees causing damage to boundary wall are designated T1 and T2 in our Arboricultural Report - SJ Stephens Associates.

These 2 trees are growing against the boundary wall leading to extensive cracking and leaning over pavement (Pilgrim's Lane), as a consequence of the increasing pressure exerted by both trees. This will get more extreme as the trees grow.

Remedy would be to remove both trees, together with any necessary structural work to the wall; as there is no evidence of subsidence, it would be most

unlikely to result in any risk of heave to the property.

We fully appreciate the importance and amenity value of trees, but there are already several mature trees growing in a very small area of garden of this property. Removal of T1 and T2, will still leave T3 (Yew tree, providing evergreen screening to garden); T4 (Lawson cypress) and T5 (mature Lime tree on corner of Pilgrim's Lane/Denning Rd). In addition, there is another mature Lime tree very close to T1 (adjacent property).
