2022/0243/PVL	Covent Garden Community Association (Elizabeth Bax, Chair of Planning Subcommittee)	27/01/2022 21:56:39	OBJ	<p>Covent Garden Community Association objects to two elements of this application:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - 11pm is too late in this residential area. - One of the tables and the end of the barrier are close to a busy junction; the arrangement creates too much of a pinch point. <p>TERMINAL HOUR</p> <p>There are 16 flats alongside this pub at 186 to 190 Drury Lane, and another 16 flats at Goldsmith Court 5 doors away. Activity outside the White Hart Pub at 191 Drury Lane does affect families living here, particularly if patrons are noisy in a drink-led environment</p> <p>Camden's Tables & Chairs guidance for this area suggests 9pm as the latest terminal hour for outside furniture to be put away. Local residents do not, in fact, object to a slightly later hour for pavement licences, but if you are minded to grant an exception, it should not go beyond 10pm.</p> <p>THIRD TABLE CANNOT BE SAFELY ACCOMMODATED</p> <p>Unfortunately the plan does not show the traffic light post, which is near to the bollard at the end of the barrier shown by Table 3. This is next to a pedestrian junction. The arrangement creates too much of a pinch point where pedestrians approach up Drury Lane and gather with pedestrians from other directions to wait for the lights.</p> <p>Pedestrians are forced between the proposed barrier and the traffic light pole, where there is not enough room. We suggest that Table 3 is omitted or moved, and that the barrier is either omitted or made shorter.</p> <p>STANDING DRINKING OUTSIDE CAUSING PROBLEMS</p> <p>We have had reports of people standing outside blocking the pavement. Please remind the premises that this must not happen and that clearance must be maintained for pedestrians at all times.</p>
