The proximity of the units to a large number of local residents makes this claim untrue.</li> <li>The concentration of the air con systems in the area proposed is unfair. A clear loss of amenity for local residents will arise if only two locations are used to provide air conditioning for such a large site.</li> <li>The consultation with local residents has been poor- the developers have not been clear about the consequences building these units may cause.</li> <li>The division of one massive hanger, to two large hangers cannot be regarded as a suitable solution. The first will remain a damaging eye-sore in a conservation area, while the second will simply add to the number of people who will be affected should the project go ahead.</li> <li>This project is grossly at odds with the conservation status of the surrounding area.</li> <li>The noise levels are projected to fall very close to the target limit.
