I am keen to see affordable housing provided for local people and recognise that the whole scheme needs to be viable. However, I would like to see the height and bulk of the larger buildings reduced, in order to protect the view. This may require building on a higher proportion of the land than is currently proposed.<br>3. From the illustrations, the cycle route seems to be the central part of a wide pavement, with nothing to warn pedestrians to pay attention. This cycle route is not like a shared (pedestrian/ cycle) path in a park; it is a valuable part of the local network and will be heavily used, especially by commuters, who tend to be in a hurry. The cycle route needs to be clearly differentiated from the pedestrian areas for the safety of all users. |
