Reducing the width and volume of this tree for two reasons: a) This tree is directly next to the building (10cm at furthest point) and therefore needs to be reduced on regular basis to avoid the tree outgrowing it's situation. b) This tree produces an unusual volume of berries (see photos) and due to the location of the tree next to the front door, this creates an unpleasant living environment for the owner. T2) Cherry on roadside boundary with number 2 The Hexagon: Reduce overall crown by up to 1 metre to retain balanced and tidy form.
