The Council has considered your application and decided to **refuse** listed building consent for the following reason(s):

Reason(s) for Refusal

1 The loss of the existing timber door and its replacement with a timber and glazed door harms the special historic and architectural significance of the Grade II listed building and its setting within this part of the Hampstead Conservation Area. The detailed design and appearance of the replacement is inappropriate and harmful. The loss of historic fabric and the harm caused by the disruption to the elevational composition of the Grade II listed building would be contrary to policy D1, D2 and D3 of the London Borough of Camden Local Plan 2017, DH1 and DH2 of the Hampstead Neighbourhood Plan, the London Plan 2021, and

the National Planning Policy Framework 2021.
