Dear Mr Bell

I have returned to the Egypt Exploration Society library today and wish to draw your attention to the current situation following the recent storms [In particular Eunice].

As a member of the EES, I use the facilities as often as possible. The library and archive are of great unique importance, internationally. Attempts at moving have been unsuccessful due to the fact the society is a self funding charity. All objectors are welcome to see for themselves the situation internally and perhaps understand better why the application has been renewed.

Over several years the cracks and uplift in the rear wall have increased. Most recent movement has dislodged more plaster and split the wall to a lower level.

The current ongoing situation is likely to result in the building becoming unsafe and a danger for those using the facilities and the materials on site.

The trees are heavily pollarded in order to mitigate damage or injury which has not been highlighted. Seasonal damage can close the facilities.

A plan to replace the loss has been offered by the Society.
