Planning List 670

2022/0340/T 33A Dartmouth Park Avenue.

I was only able to look at the trees in the front garden.

Rear garden (from photographs)

T1: no objection to the work on the Black Poplar

T2: no objection to the removal of 0.5m to the Chestnut trunk

T3: unable to comment as no photograph provided

T5: to me it looks like a self-seeded tree in a dense canopy that will not be able to grow to maturity

Front garden

T6: this also looks to me a self-seeded sapling in a dense canopy that cannot grow to maturity

T7: the Cherry has a tall narrow habit, somewhat similar to a flagpole cherry, but maybe due to its close proximity to the house growing towards the light. It is approximately 1metre from the front bay window. I consider this to be inappropriately planted, too near to the property.

T8: not objection to reducing the Olive by 2-3m, it needs regular maintenance.

2022/0349/T. 33 Dartmouth Park Avenue

T4: The photograph shows a dead/dying tree with ivy growing up its trunk, therefore I do not object to its felling to ground level.

2022/0399/T. 37 Dartmouth Park Avenue

I do not object to the maintenance work on this Mulberry tree. We do not have many in Dartmouth Park.

2022/0441/T. 20 Croftdown Road

I agree that this Olive tree needs regular maintenance, but have some concern that 5m off the canopy height may be too much, and not leave the 'natural canopy outline' desired. List 672
